



Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back! We hope you had a lovely break over Summer - it has been wonderful to welcome the children into their new classes. They have settled in well and shown great enthusiasm towards their lessons. Please see below for the outline of what the children will be learning this half term:

History:

This half term we will be learning all about WW2 in our History unit 'Wartime Westhoughton'. We will begin by creating timelines of all the historical events/eras studied so far, seeing where WW2 is in relation to those. We will go on to sequence some of the key events of WW2, use sources to ask and answer questions, learn about the impact the war had on the local area and on the people living in Westhoughton and

Art:

The children will begin their collage unit by looking at the work of Evelyn Dunbar and how she represented life during the World War II. They will continue to develop their drawing skills by looking at tone and shading and applying this to their own self portraits. This will then be developed into creating a self portrait and collage art piece depicting themselves at the time of the war.

Science:

In Science this half term we are learning all about living things and their habitats. We will explore our school grounds for living things in their natural habitats and look at the seven life processes. We will learn about different animal groups and how to group them using classification keys. We will also focus on our natural environment and factors that can affect habitats.

PE: In PE this term, we will develop the skills of balancing, running and jumping. A range of games will be played to allow the children to apply the skills and to develop them further. We will also continue to take part in our daily mile time.

RE:

Our Enquiry Question in RE this half term is 'What do Christians learn from the creation story?' In this unit we will be learning about where 'creation' and 'the fall' are in the Bible, what the creation story teaches Christians, the relationship between people and God, the story of Adam & Eve, temptation and the ten commandments.



PSHE:

The children will be starting their learning on relationships this half term. They will develop their knowledge of families and how these look. They will look at the role of families and what they provide for us. We will also look at what an unhealthy relationship is and how to seek help.



Computing:

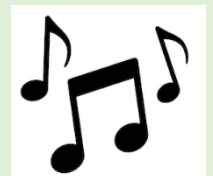
In computing we will be learning about what it means to be a good citizen online. We will learn about cyber bullying, how to stay safe online and what our digital footprint is.



Music:

We will start the year by starting our unit on chair drumming. The children will use a drumsticks and a chair as a drum kit. They will develop their sense of rhythm and learn how to follow a graphic score which will accompany a selection of pop songs.

The children will develop an understanding of 1, 2 and 4 beat notes at differing tempos
